

FLCC NURSING PROGRAM

What are my chances of getting in?

Are you interested in the nursing program at FLCC and wondering what your chances are for admission? Admission to the nursing program is based strictly on a point system. To calculate the number of points you have earned, simply follow the step-by-step instructions on this worksheet. Each year, we receive approximately 1,000 applications for the 80 seats in the program. This worksheet will provide you with a better idea of what we are looking for and where you might stand in the applicant pool. All courses that are considered must be COMPLETED by the February 1st application deadline.

Prerequisites: required for all applicants

- Chemistry (CHM 102) and Algebra (DST 042) must be successfully completed prior to your first semester of nursing coursework. High school algebra and chemistry can count for these prerequisites. High school biology or one semester of college biology is also required.
- You must have an overall GPA of 2.5 or better (or a 2.0 if you have a bachelor's degree) and have received a grade of C or better in all courses taken toward the nursing program. In addition, grades of I, Q or W in any point getting course must be repeated successfully prior to being considered for admission.

Step 1: *If you have taken the courses listed in the chart below, use **Point Key 1** to determine the number of points earned based on your grade. Also be sure to factor in possible point reductions (see below).*

Point Reductions: • *If repeating Anatomy & Physiology I and/or II because of an unsuccessful completion (this means earning a grade below a C, an I, Q or W), then **deduct 1/2 of the points for the repeated course.***

- *If you have two unsuccessful completions of either of these courses, **you will receive 0 points for the repeated course.***

Step 2: If you have taken the courses listed in the chart below, use **Point Key 2** to determine the number of points earned based on your grade. *Please Note: If you have taken BIO 110 in addition to A&P I, points will **only** be awarded for A&P I.

***Point Reductions:** If repeating any of the courses below because you were unsuccessful in your first attempt (earned grade below a C, an I, Q or W), deduct 1/2 of the points for the repeated course. If you have two unsuccessful completions, **you will receive 0 points.**

**The maximum number of points that can be earned is 90. The more points you have earned, the better chance you have of being admitted. The average number of points earned by accepted students varies year to year based on the applicant pool. The program is very competitive.
